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






Stations on Federally Designated EV Alternative Fuel Corridors

- + At Least (4) 150 kW DC Fast Charging Ports (600kW Total)
- + Open to General Public 24/7

KY EV Charging Program




- + \$25 million in NEVI formula funds (FY 22 & 23)
- + Another \$15 million available in October 2024
- + Funds must first be spent to build-out AFCs
 - + Federally designated Alternative Fuel Corridors
 - + Federal requirement for all states
- + After build-out FHWA will allow more flexibility
 - + More guidance expected in the future
 - + Other high priority corridors or community charging




Kentucky's High Priority EV Corridors








Federal Guidance Updates



+ Updated Federal Guidance Issued on June 2, 2023

+ AFC Build-out Criteria

- + All creditable charging stations must meet NEVI requirements
- + Stations needed within 25 miles of a corridor termini
- + Stations needed every 50 miles in any logical travel direction

+ EV Plan Update Requirements

- + Provided an updated document outline
- + Updated plans due by August 1
- + Additional details and clarifications (e.g., ROW, NEPA, and other topics)
- + Additional information (webinars and Joint Office Q&A)

+ Round 1 ended on June 13, 2023 + Two categories: + Corridor Programs + Community Programs + **\$2.5 billion** over five years + \$700 million for FY 2022-23 + Prepare now for the next round! + Go to the bottom of the EV Plan


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Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program



Eligible parties



*that own publicly accessible transportation facilities



Corridor Program Grants



- + Up to **\$350 million** (nationally)
- + Must be on Federally designated AFCs (Interstates and Parkways in KY)
- + Minimum award \$1million; no maximum
- + Must use funds to contract with a private entity
- + Must address environmental justice
- + Needs to be accessible and usable by individuals with disabilities



Community Program Grants



- + Up to \$350 million (nationally)
- + Can fund charging in any publicly accessible location in the state (not limited to AFCs)
- + Awards from **\$500,000 to \$15 million**
- + Must address environmental justice
- + Must be accessible and usable by individuals with disabilities




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
